Benjamin Storchan is a research excavation archaeologist for the Jerusalem Region of the Israel Antiquities Authority. He is currently a PhD candidate at Ben Gurion University of the Negev, writing a dissertation on Byzantine churches in the Holy Land during the transition to the early Islamic Period. Storchan has directed several large-scale excavations, including the Glorious Martyr excavations, the Pre- and Proto-historic settlements at Eshtaol, and landscape archaeology projects near Bet Shemesh. He has published multiple articles on Byzantine churches in the Holy Land, oil lamp production in the Roman period, and numerous final excavation reports.
